Sue Sherman will be doing a workshop on "**Traditional Hawaiian Quilting**". Sue lived most of 2012 through 2014 in Honolulu where she was part of a quilting class, and there she learned about the techniques, designs and cultural significance of Hawaiian quilting. This class uses hand applique and hand quilting.

Arlene began to sew as a child and transitioned to quilting when she was a young wife and mother.
