
Tips and Tricks

From Cheryl at Creemore House of Stitches:

To stop your sewing machine foot pedal from sliding around on a wood floor while you are sewing, use a silicone iron rest. The raised points side should be placed on the floor and the foot pedal on the smooth side.

'On retirement, I began my quilting journey. I started with traditional quilting and after a landscape workshop my interest was sparked into creating art quilts. I have been honored by my peers in the Georgian Bay Quilting Guild at their biannual Quilt Show with a second in the Guild Challenge. The next show I was honored with the Viewers' choice first place award. Before quilting became a passion, I was a spinner, natural wool dyer, and weaver. I have always enjoyed creating original pieces.

I work with fabric to create art quilts of landscapes and flowers much as a painter uses paint. My art quilts use layers of fabric to give a realistic portrayal of nature in non-traditional quilting. With each project I try new techniques to make each piece unique.'

Location: Penetang Memorial Arena


Sign up will start at the February Meeting!

Date Squares

1 cup packed brown sugar

½ cup margarine or butter, softened

¼ cup shortening

1 ¾ cup all-purpose* or whole wheat flour

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon baking soda

1 ½ cup quick-cooking oats

Date Filling (below)

Prepare Date Filling.

Heat oven to 400F.

Mix brown sugar, margarine and shortening.

Mix in remaining ingredients.

Press Half of the mixture in greased oblong pan, 13 x 9 x 2 inches; spread with filling.

Top with remaining crumbly mixture, pressing lightly.

Bake until light brown, 25 to 30 minutes.

Cut into bars, about $2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ inches, while warm.

Yield - 3 dozen bars

*if using self-rising flour, omit salt and baking soda.

Date filling

Heat 1 pound of dates, cup up (about 3 cups), 1 ½ cups water and 1 /4 cup sugar over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened, about 10 minutes, cool.
