Are you struggling with your Black Bag Quilt Challenge? Do you need help with a certain aspect of your bag? Then this is the workshop for you!

Vicky, who spoke to us back in November sharing her experiences with her own handbag business, has agreed to show us the basics of making a Tote Bag/Handbag including zippers, lining, adjustable straps and adding embellishments etc.

For the "Handbag" workshop you will need to bring at least a 15" zipper as well as material to use as lining and pockets, about 1 meter. Vicky has some heavy fabric that she is willing to provide for this workshop or you can bring your own fabric.

If you have your own "bag" pattern, be sure to bring the pattern and the supplies required. Vicky can walk you through the process or help you with any problems you may be having.

## Easiest Ever Lemon Squares

Not only do our members have amazing quilting skills, but they can also whip up some very tasty treats. Many of us have sampled them at our guild meetings. This often leads to the question; 'Can you share the recipe?'

This month Jan Dzoch said 'Yes' and is sharing this 'Easiest Ever Lemon Squares recipe.

EASIEST EVER LEMON SQUARES (submitted by Sharon in Ontario to Food.com)

Ready in: 1 hr 3 mins Yields: 20 - 25 squares

Ingredients: 8 Serves: 20 - 25



#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 cup all purpose flour

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup butter

1/3 cup raspberry jam

2 eggs

1 (212 g) package Shirriff Lemon Pie Filling

1/2 cup ground almonds

1/4 cup sliced almonds

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- Combine flour and sugar, then butter until the mixture clumps together. Press firmly into 8" (20 cm) square pan. Bake at 350 (180C) oven 15 18 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from oven and spread with jam.
- 2. Beat eggs until light and creamy. Beat in pie filling and ground almonds. Pour over jam layer. Sprinkle with sliced almonds. Bake 20 25 minutes or until set and firm to touch. Cool. Cut into squares.
- 3. Hint: For Lemon Coconut Square substitute 1 cup flaked coconut (½ in mixture & ½ for topping) for the ground almonds and sliced almonds The original recipe called for 1½ cups of coconut but I only used 1 cup total.
