Medium Bag → Michelle Murray


Large Bag → Martha Leonard

Carrot-Walnut Cupcakes

(Recipe courtesy of Food Network Kitchen) ADAPTED

Yields – 12 cupcakes

Ingredients for the Cupcakes

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 34 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup unsalted butter, melted
- 1/3 cup walnut oil or vegetable oil (I used vegetable oil)
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 ¾ cups finely grated carrots

(about 2 medium)

- ½ cup walnuts, roughly chopped
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped candies ginger (I didn't use this)

Directions for the Cupcakes

- 1 Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Line a 12-cup muffin pan with liners. Whisk the flour, baking power, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg in a medium bowl. Whisk the eggs, granulated sugar, brown sugar, melted butter, vegetable or walnut oil and vanilla in a large bowl until smooth. Whisk in the flour mixture, then fold in the grated carrots, chopped walnuts and candied ginger with a rubber spatula.
- 2 Divide the batter among the prepared muffin cups, filling each two-thirds of the way. Bake until the tops of the cupcakes spring back when gently pressed, about 20 minutes. Let cool 5 minutes in the pan; remove to a rack to cool completely.



For the Frosting

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 8 ounce package cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 3 1/2 cups confectioners sugar, sifted

Directions for the frosting

Beat the butter, cream cheese, vanilla and salt in a large bowl with a mixer on medium-high speed until smooth. Beat in **sifted** confectioners' sugar on low speed; increase the speed to medium high and beath until fluffy, 3 minutes. Transfer to a piping bag with a large round tip; pipe onto the cupcakes.

For the candied carrots and walnuts (Optional)

Cooking spray
1 large carrot

3/4 cup granulated sugar

3/4 cup water

12 walnuts

Meanwhile, make the candied carrots and walnuts. Coat a baking sheet with cooking spray. Peel 12 long ribbons from the carrot using a vegetable peeler. Combine the sugar and water in a small saucepan and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to a simmer, add the carrot ribbons and cook until translucent, 25 to 30 minutes. Carefully remove with tongs and arrange each ribbon in a small bundle on a baking sheet. Add the walnuts to the saucepan and simmer until glossy, 5 minutes. Remove with a slotted spoon and place on the baking sheet; let the candied carrots and walnuts cool.
