Jeannie will demonstrate embroidery stitches with floss, beads will be introduced and ribbon flowers and foliage.



To help save \$ on styrofoam cups and to help out our environment, please bring your own mug for the refreshments that will follow each meeting.

...from March 3, 1993 -> Call For Quilter's

Approximately 50 people interested in starting a quilt guild in the North Simcoe County area, gathered at the Georgian Manor in Penetanguishene. We were each given a name tag and asked to fill out a questionnaire regarding our skills and specific interests. We were welcomed by Sue Hopkinson, who led the discussion for the evening. The following items were agreed to, by those in attendance:

- > to meet on the 4th Wednesday of each month, at the Georgian Manor, with the first meeting to be March 24th. Meetings will be held year `round.
- > our membership fee will be \$20, to paid in cash (beginning March 24th), until such time as a bank account can be set up. Fee will be for 1 year, with membership year beginning each March.
- > a 'show & tell' will be held at each meeting. Bring 'work in progress', finished articles, antique articles, problems, etc.
- > refreshments will be purchased for each meeting.

We enjoyed a widely varied 'show & tell' of quilted articles and wound up the evening with conversations and light refreshments.

March 10, 1993 > 1st Executive Meeting

A number of people indicated on their questionnaires, that they would be willing to serve on our executive. A meeting was organized by Sue Hopkinson, at the home of Mary McDonald. A discussion of the questionnaire results, showed that everyone wants to learn and

improve their quilting skills. With this in mind, our meeting programmes will feature demonstrations, discussions and 'block of the month'. Workshops are being organized to begin as soon as possible. Other points discussed:

- > The guild name will be chosen, by those attending the March 24th meeting, from suggestions from the group.
- > Guests are welcome at our meetings. Beginning April 28, 1993, guest admission is \$3 limit 4 visits per year. An exception will be made for Georgian Manor residents.
- > Guild members will have preference over non-members for workshop/course spaces.




