4. I use colours and patterns that make me happy. While I appreciate all the work, time and effort that goes into each item, and will try to take and use what I have learned that works for me, the colours of the piece need to speak to me. I am learning to apply this to what may not appeal to me due to colour (don't go there as I really don't like orange but can appreciate fall colours) or pattern to what appeals to me. What works for me as well in accepting colour is heritage and I will embrace colour I don't necessarily work with (need I say Stonehenge and England and the panels). This will be an ongoing journey believe me given my heritage!

5.Use workshops to learn. Workshops, while providing a great item to create, may not provide a project that you want to do. However they do teach techniques. I have been using each workshop as a learning experience of what works for me or what I want to apply it to or what could I use it for, to just using it as a technique to broaden my horizons. I may not finish the workshop expectations (e.g. a quilt) for what it was designed for but have used it to learn the technique and apply it to something that works for me. Ultimately the learning experience was great and broadened my horizons.

As my mother used to say, many hands make light work. The guild would appreciate it if a member would volunteer to fill the following positions:

Publicity:

This position would involve emailing or visiting our local quilt shops, longarm quilting businesses, or other businesses that might be related to our guild, to advertise in our newsletter and be a sponsored link on our website and in our newsletter. The work involved in

this position is usually accomplished during July, August and September and entails very little work after that.

Importance to the guild. The advertising revenue raised helps the guild programs and other activities and helps keep our membership fees low.

Quilt Show, 2020, Two positions vacant.

Publicity:

This involves contacting local business (Midland, Pentang) to place posters and bookmarks in their stores, etc. to promote the show. Local guilds are sent bookmarks and contacted via email to place a notice in their newsletter about our quilt show. Media releases are prepared for any news organizations that may list the show on the activity calendars, without charge. On the Friday before the show, quilt show signs are placed along predetermined routes directing traffic to the show. These signs are picked up on Sunday afternoon.

Importance to the guild: The success of the quilt show is dependent on spreading the news about the show to as many people as possible.

Volunteer Coordinator:

This position involves receiving the volunteer forms and assigning the volunteers to specific times and places for the quilt show. As well, the volunteer coordinator and/or her assistant will check off the volunteers as they come for their shifts

Importance to the guild:

This position is critical to the organization of the guilt show.

- 7. Paper or notebook and pen for note taking
- 8. Lunch and drink if other than coffee or tea is needed
- 9. Slippers or shoes (if so desired)


